We have had a great month in October for the ARDB and managed to get 1282 new records into the database bringing the total records to 56071.

Much of this help was from Andre Botha with two large submissions for South Africa, but also some records supplied by Clive Barlow for the Gambia, and also really chuffed to see one person, Sebastian Tham, using the online app for iPhone.

November is earmarked for the development of the offline apps with half of the development funds in already and other prospects for funding on the horizon at least. We really appreciate the support of an anonymous donor from the States who has taken an active interest in our project.


