Most data (91%) came in via the App from southern and East Africa (see graphic). The new proforma spreadsheet has been trialled effectively by the GIENIOKOLO team (obs by S. Souane and co-workers) and Rowen van Eeden who kindly supplied raptor observations from his field studies in Kruger National Park. We have assisted Rowen with data on Martial Eagles for his PhD and Rowen has been the first to sign a formal data release agreement with the ARDB. The ARDB will endeavour to supply data for free to bona fide academic projects but may have to make charges when this takes more than a couple of hours. We have a new data charges policy to cover this which may be viewed on our project website www.habitatinfo.com/ardb. It was great to receive so many records

this month from Andre again and Dirk Human in South Africa and from Munir and colleagues and Brian Waswala from Kenya. All contributions very appreciated and we were excited to receive a record of a Common Buzzard from Madeira by Lou Luddington using the app!
